### **Notice Regarding Revision of Year-end Dividend Forecast (Dividend Increase)**

IBIDEN Co., Ltd. (hereinafter the “Company”) hereby announced that it has decided to revise the forecast for dividends of surplus with a record date of March 31, 2026, which forecast was announced on October 30, 2025, as described below. This matter is scheduled to be approved at a meeting of the Board of Directors to be held on May 19, 2026.

#### 1. Details of revision

The company implemented a stock split at a ratio of two shares for every one share of common stock effective January 1, 2026. The figures for the actual results for the previous fiscal year and the end of the second quarter of the current fiscal year are the adjusted dividends per share.

The dividend per share of 15 yen for the end of the second quarter includes a commemorative dividend of 5 yen.

#### 2. Reasons

The company has adopted a policy, from the fiscal year ending March 2026 through the fiscal year ending March 2031, of progressive dividend based on an annual dividend of 20 yen per share, with a guideline of 20% payout ratio, while considering a balance between growth investments and financial discipline.

Based on this basic policy and after comprehensively considering the current fiscal year's performance, etc., we have decided to revise the year-end dividend forecast, increasing it by 5 yen per share from the previous forecast of 10 yen per share, to 15 yen.
